Dear Nordig Canada Awards Committee,

This letter is to nominate – without reservation and in the strongest possible terms – Eric Luiker for a Distinguished Volunteer Award.

Eric has worn many hats in local, provincial, and regional cross-country skiing. Forever positive and always willing to roll up his sleeves to get the job done, he has been an extraordinary presence in the sport since 2001, when he and his young family moved to Fredericton from St. John's and joined the Wostawea Cross-Country Ski Club. As Jackrabbit coordinator, long-standing executive member, founding coach of the Ski Team, and visionary leader of ambitious infrastructure projects, Eric has contributed enormously to the spectacular growth in popularity of cross-country skiing in Fredericton. Although our city's population is just 60,000, Wostawea is now one of the largest clubs in Canada, with close to 1100 members. Eric has played a central role in that success and in fostering the amazing club spirit among skiers of all levels.

Soon after joining Wostawea (at the time a club of 300 or so), Eric breathed new life into its Jackrabbit and Track Attack programs: he recruited new coaches (including the two of us) and led a highly successful first season as coordinator in 2003, building the program and professionalizing its volunteer coaches through provision of training opportunities through CCC (as it was then).

Nine years later, Eric recognized a problem: kids who finished the Jackrabbit and Track Attack programs no longer had a ski community to motivate them and structure their activities. In 2012, he filled that gap by starting the Wostawea Racing Team, now the Wostawea Ski Team. It was, and still is, a ton of work: coaching athletes and recruiting assistant coaches, team managers, waxers, and parent volunteers. Through Eric's leadership the Ski Team has become a flagship program and phenomenal success. Indeed, over 70 youth from 10-18 (and several adults) have participated in the program in its first 10 seasons, and many of them have literally grown up in it, attending Eric's high-energy dryland or on-snow sessions three or four times a week from early October to late March over multiple seasons. They have skied in NB Cup races. They have qualified for Joliette and the Easterns. They have competed at Nationals and the Canada Winter Games. They have become role models for our younger members. And they have had fun and formed lasting bonds with other skiers and coaches. Meanwhile, each year, Eric encouraged adults to race at the Master's level and did so himself on many occasions.

In addition to club-level coaching, Eric has organized numerous training camps for the New Brunswick provincial team and has been a leading voice on the provincial high-performance committee. Always wanting to improve his own skills as a coach, Eric has taken several courses and attended numerous workshops, including on the mental and emotional components of coaching, and on how to work with athletes to set goals, manage expectations, and roll with the punches of competitive skiing. He has trained up to the T2T level and is also qualified to teach the Community Coaching course. An experienced coach at previous Easterns and Nationals, Eric will be the New Brunswick team's assistant coach at the 2023 Canada Winter Games.

Eric is by far the longest-serving member of the Wostawea executive committee, initially as Jackrabbit coordinator, then as Ski Team lead, and currently as vice-president. For many years he wrote our weekly newsletter, and in the past decade, he has spearheaded numerous crucial club initiatives, most notably our partnership with the City of Fredericton to turn Killarney Lake Park into a cross-country ski destination. Indeed, he was a core member of the small team that raised over \$300,000 from three levels of government and club members for new trail design and construction at Killarney, and in 2016-17 he single-handedly raised an additional \$50,000 from local businesses to leverage City funds toward the purchase of a PistenBully groomer. Since that year, Killarney has become one of the top two ski centres in New Brunswick, with 25 km of groomed trails and a unique ski terrain park for the Jackrabbits, Track Attackers, and Ski Team athletes (which Eric also raised money for and made happen). More recently, Eric has turned his attention to advocating for a new facility at Killarney to accommodate the club's growth and future plans, and he is also spearheading a drive for a full-time paid coach.

Through all the positive changes of the past two decades, Eric has slowly and patiently worked with City officials, executive members, and local stakeholders to realize his vision for Killarney Lake Park. In the coming year, we will apply for homologation status for our racing trails so we can host national events. When we do, Eric will be leading the way!

In sum, Eric is a visionary leader and tireless worker whose passion for cross-country skiing has inspired and benefitted thousands of skiers throughout our region. We are thrilled to nominate him for a Distinguished Volunteer Award.
